What is a student tutor?

Your main duty is to help our foreign students to settle in the new country, city and university. You can help them with practical questions, such as planning their trip to Germany, finding the way around the campus and the city centre and take the chance to enjoy free-time activities with them.

How much time does it take?

You should have approx. three hours per week for one semester or at least during the first weeks after the arrival of the new students. Furthermore, the foreign students should have the possibility to turn to the tutor later on when encountering problems.
