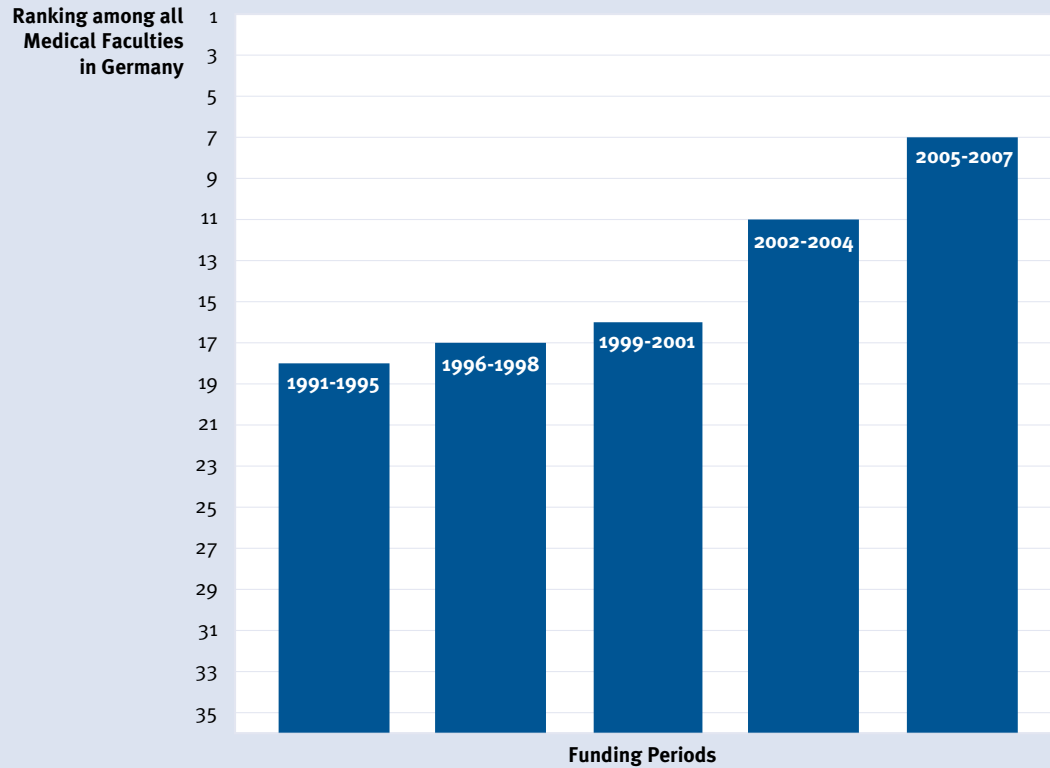

Acquired external funds per professor (Source DFG)



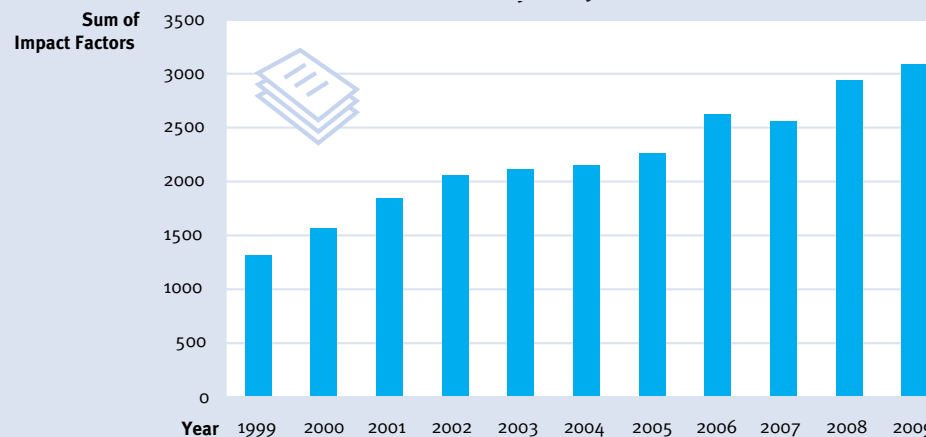
Ulm as an economic center in the south of Germany

Ulm and its sister city New-Ulm are the economic center of a large region that lies between the Swabian Alb and Lake Constance. Approximately 170,000 people including 15,000 students live in both cities and more than 1,000,000 inhabit the region of Danube Iller. There are over 8,500 businesses from diverse areas and branches of industry, among which are such enterprises with a world-wide reputation as Iveco-Magirus (Commercial Vehicles), Evo-Bus (formerly Kässbohrer) (Buses), EADS Germany, Ratiopharm and Merckle (Pharmaceutical Industry), Gardena (Gardening Tools), Ulrich (Medical Technology), Takata-Petri (Vehicle Security Systems), Nokia (Mobile Communications), and the Daimler Science Center. Today, there are more than 90,000 employment opportunities in Ulm and, with some 8,600 employees, Ulm University has become the city's largest employer.

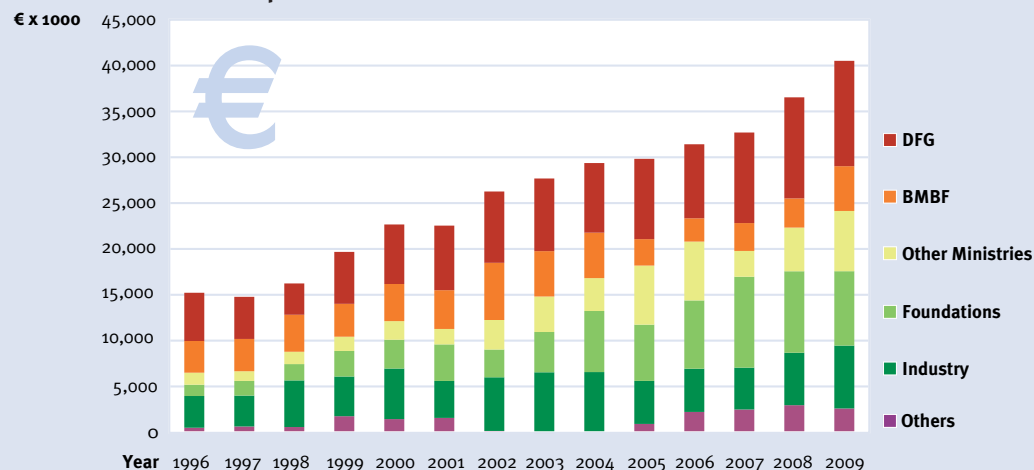
The rapid industrial and scientific development of our city has not remained unnoticed outside Ulm. The well-known journal *Capital* writes: “... In recent years, Ulm has pursued a technology policy that has become exceedingly successful. Modern service and research facilities as well as attractive scenic surroundings promise further dynamic developments for real estate”. According to the Institute of the German Economy (IW): “Today, Ulm as a job market is among the top performing cities in Germany. In the ratio of registered citizens to the number of employees subject to social security contributions, Ulm has reached fourth place.” In addition to this, the Handelsblatt attests to the innovative economic and structural policy of the city of Ulm: “Ulm is one of the *quiet stars* and one of the regions in Germany with the greatest growth potential.” Ulm University Medicine is also one of the motors that has helped to drive this development. For instance, third-party funding has increased by some 270% in the last 14 years from €15.2 million in 1996 to €40.5 million in 2009 while the number of people employed by means of this funding has increased from 480 to 681 in the last four years.

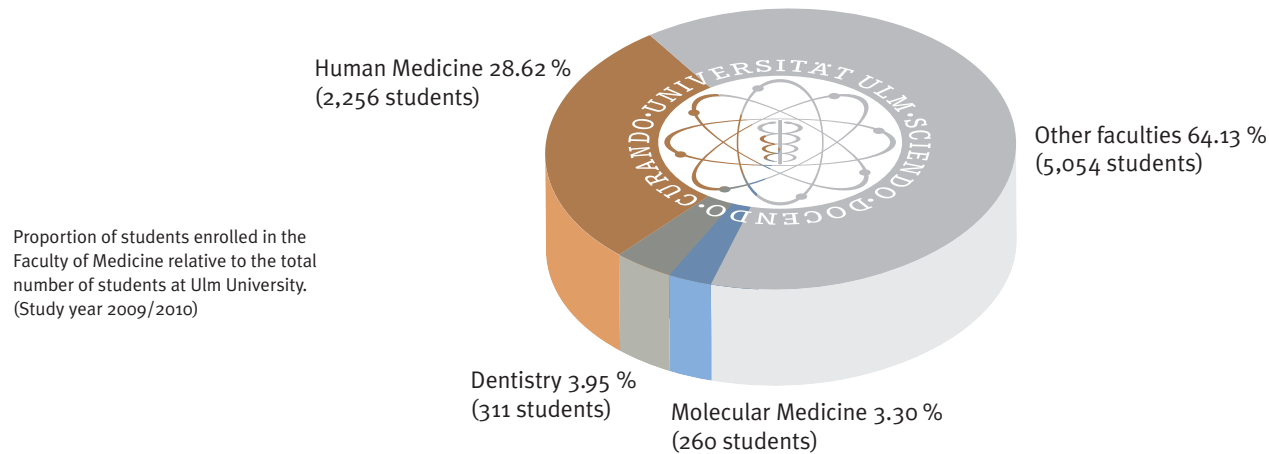
Sum of Impact Factors of Papers Published by Scientists of Ulm University Medicine*

Examinations at Ulm

In 2009, 319 students at Ulm University undertook the final national board examination in Human Medicine. The results of this examination were comparative to the nationwide average of 226.98 out of a maximum of 319 accessible points. Around half of all students studying Human Medicine complete their studies over an average period (*Regelstudienzeit*) of 12 semesters. In Germany, the average final mark of graduates based on the results of a written and an oral examination varies between “well” and “adequate”. Graduates of Dentistry and Molecular Medicine on average attain “good” results.

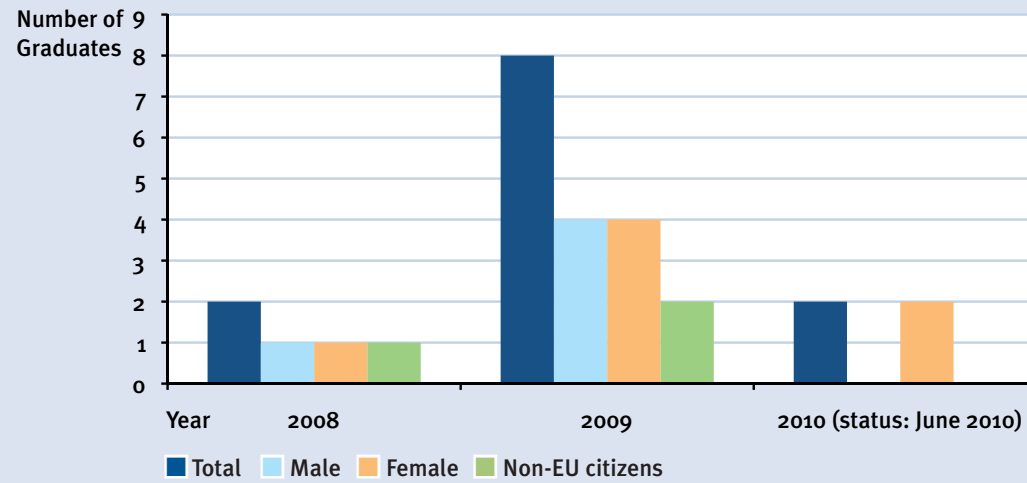

Student Statistics

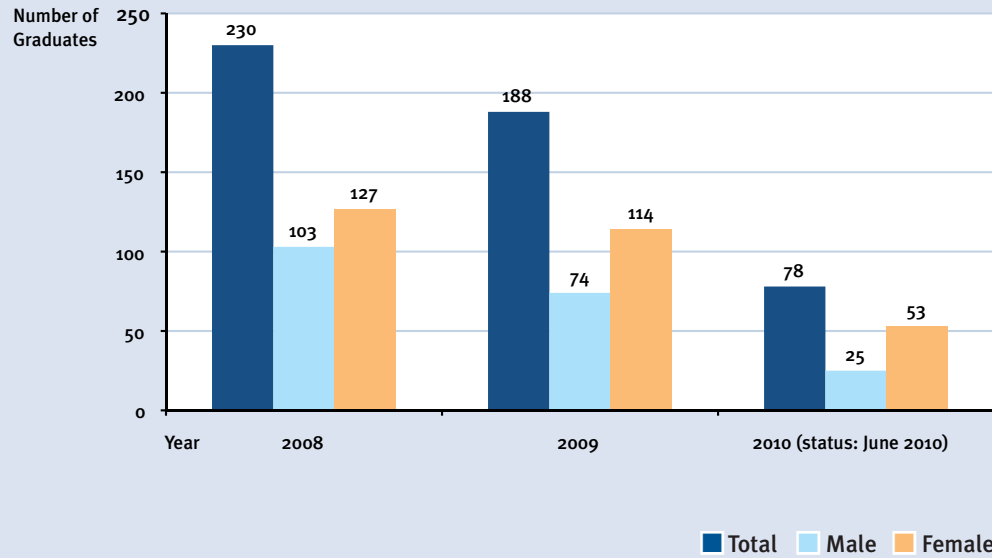
Since the academic year of 2004/2005, the Medical Faculty at Ulm has registered a student intake that has increased by 10.65% up to the academic year of 2009/2010. In comparison, the number of inhabitants in Ulm has risen between 2005 and 2008 by 0.84%. According to a forecast relating to demographic changes in Ulm, the proportion of inhabitants between the ages of 18 and 35 will steadily increase year by year. As a result of this, Ulm will eventually be designated a university city and will have to adapt to the needs of this younger generation.

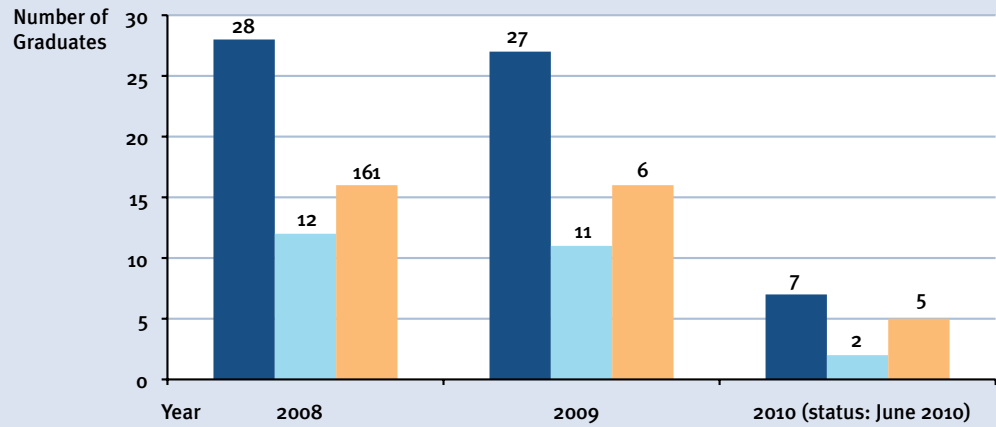
Number of Graduates – Dr. rer. nat. and PhD – from the International Graduate School in Molecular Medicine Ulm 2008-2010



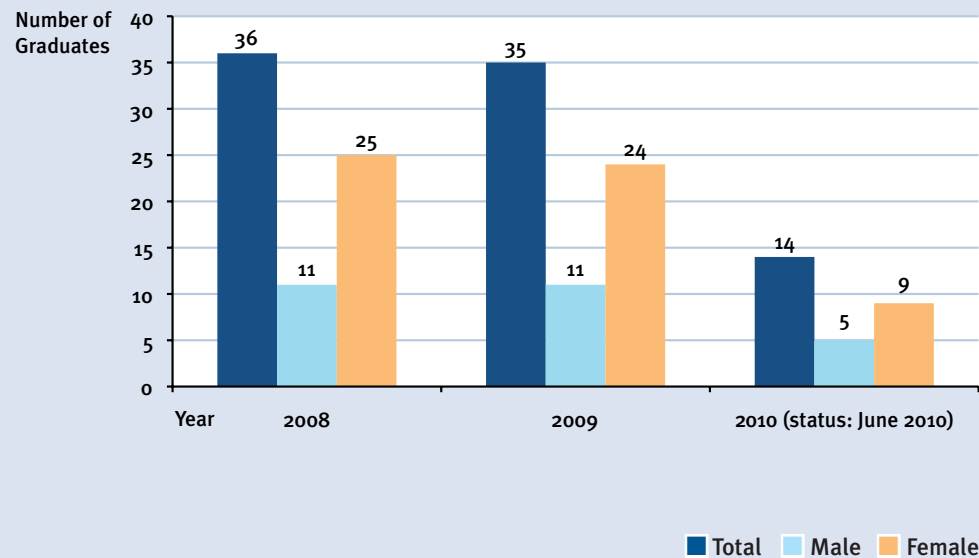
Number of Graduates – Dr. med. – 2008-2010



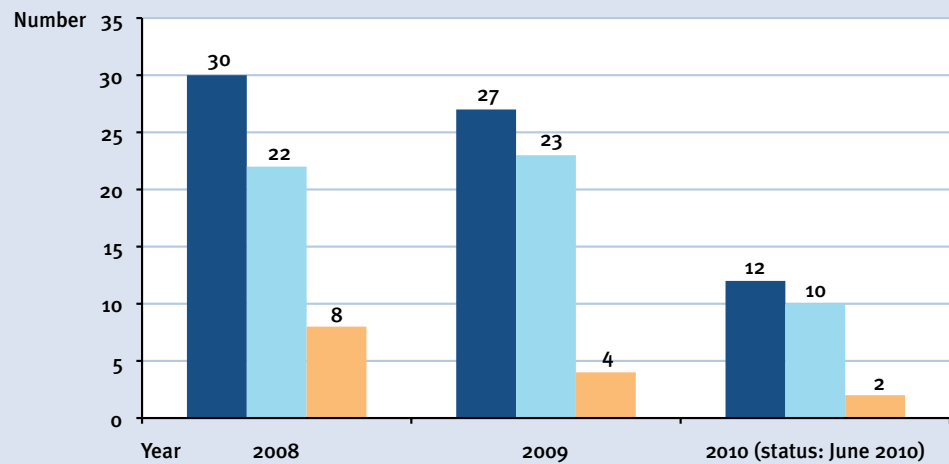
Number of Graduates – Dr. med. dent. – 2008-2010
