

Corona Info Sheet - Current Information on Your Arrival and Your Stay in Ulm

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, there are a number of special regulations concerning entry into Germany. These rules are relevant for those entering the Federal Republic of Germany by land, sea, or air as well as those who have stayed in a so-called risk area during the 10 days preceding entry.

What if I have already been vaccinated or have recovered from COVID-19?

Proof of vaccination or of recovery from COVID-19 can exempt you from the negative test and quarantine requirements. This does not apply if you have spent time in an area of variants of concern prior to entry.

Please note: Since Thursday, 3 March 2022, no states or regions have been considered high-risk areas. For the time being, the obligation to quarantine will be in force at least until 19 March 2022.

Where can I get a Corona test?

Corona tests can be taken directly at the airport after your arrival, at a test center in Ulm (see: https://www.ulm.de/0/zsddv/corona-testzentren, website only in German), or at a doctor's office in Ulm. Please note: Call the doctor's office before going there! Please take proof of health insurance with you to your appointment (e. g. EHIC – European Health Insurance Card or travel health insurance). The test costs 80 €.

Where can I get vaccinated?

If you received a full course of a vaccine that is **not currently recognized by the EU**, you are formally considered as unvaccinated in Germany. In situations requiring 3G proof (Geimpft – Getestet – Genesen, in English: Vaccinated – Tested – Recovered), you must present a negative test. **Our recommendation:** Receive an additional vaccine that has been recognized by the EU. Please contact a doctor for individual advice.

Do I need to be tested for COVID-19 if I want to attend in-person classes?

The 3G rule (Geimpft – Getestet – Genesen, in English: Vaccinated – Tested – Recovered) applies to participation in onsite courses and examinations. The Corona negative test must not be older than 24 hours of a rapid antigen test and 48 hours of a PCR test.

Wearing an FFP2 mask is mandatory in all rooms and areas designated for study use. An exception exists when giving a presentation.
