Wahl der Gasthochschule und Bewerbungsverfahren

To be eligible for a medical rotation abroad it is required to be sponsored by a local university that is furthermore affiliated with a teaching hospital. Usually most universities in the USA take international medical students only for a period of up to 2 months. However, I was lucky to find Rocky Vista University in Parker Colorado, which accepted me for a total period of 4 months. In contrast to my previous rotations in Pittsburgh and at Yale Medical School, I didn't have to pay any tuition fees. The application process was quite easily, I only needed my CV, a proof of immunization, a negative drug screening and a supporting letter from the University of Ulm. I first contacted the affiliated hospital, which then forwarded all my documents to the University.

Because I already had spent four months in the USA prior to this rotation, I was already used to living abroad. I found an apartment through www.craigslist.org, a website where people offer housing, cars and all different stuff. One should be very careful in choosing an accommodation, because quite often, strange people offer housing on these websites. Luckily, I found an apartment in walking distance to the hospital. Close to my apartment, one could easily access the light rail train to downtown, Denver. This took approximately a twenty-minute train ride and it was going all night long.

During the four months in Denver I had to work on weekends only now and then, therefore I had time to take tours around Colorado, e.g. doing a weekend camping trip to the Moab desert in Utah. On idle weekends I often went downtown with friends, there is always something going on, and many people enjoy the nightlife on Denver rooftops.

If interested in hiking or skiing, one should definitely spend some time in Colorado. The climate is amazing, during the time I was living there, the temperature was always above 30°C with no humidity at all.

III. Akademische Beurteilung

This elective was sponsored by the Rocky Vista University of Osteopathic Medicine (RVUCOM) in Parker, Colorado, where I was enrolled as an official international student. With several teaching hospitals around Denver, Rocky Vista University is an official institution approved by the World Health Organization.

During my time, I was assigned to the service of Dr. Eric Jamrich, who is the head of the Spine and Joint Program. The hospital I worked at is one of the largest teaching hospitals in the Denver area and provides the full spectrum of surgery. During my rotation, I was supposed to be active during surgery, and see patients during office clinic. I assisted in approximately 200 surgeries and saw close to 1000 patients during clinic. The main surgeries performed were large spine reconstructive cases, such as scoliosis or lumbar inter-body fusions, endoprosthesis of the hips and knees, as well as fracture surgeries.

Luckily, working hours were not as busy as during my earlier rotations. Surgery days usually started at 7 am and lasted till 5-7 pm. Office days started at 8 am and lasted until 4 pm; during these hours I saw patients, examined and then presented them to my assigned attending surgeon. During rounds in the morning, I usually presented patients to the physician assistant and we decided together about further treatment plans.

At the end of my rotation the Dean of the University signed my documents, which were then passed on to the office of student affairs at the University of Ulm.

I can highly recommend Rocky Vista University and Sky Ridge Medical Center for an elective rotation in Denver. Both facilities are dedicated to teaching and contributed to having a great educational time.
