Language of Instruction	<p>German and English</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In general, the language of instruction is German. Most study programs offered at Ulm University are German-taught programs. However, there may be select courses taught in English even in German study programs. In addition, there is a growing number of Master programs taught in English. • Medicine and Dentistry are strictly taught in German (including exams or clinical electives). • Students wishing to do a project or thesis in any of the other subject areas do not need to prove proficiency in German, as long as they have sufficient command of English.
Admission to Master Level Courses	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students should have successfully completed at least 3 years of study (approx. 180 ECTS) in the field of study of the Erasmus agreement. • Exceptions may be granted to students in their final Bachelor year, if the home university confirms that they offer this mobility window explicitly for students to take Master courses. • All students must meet the linguistic and academic requirements of any given course.
Courses from other Departments and Faculties	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students are expected to choose the majority of their courses and/or credits in that department which is the sponsor of the inter-institutional agreement. • They may choose up to two courses per semester from study programmes in other departments / faculties. Admission to courses in other departments / faculties can be restricted, giving priority to degree students and students coming over a direct agreement with that particular department. • In addition, students may take courses from the School of Humanities (language courses, philosophy, soft skills). • Courses from career-integrated programmes or the continuing professional education programmes offered by the School of Advanced Professional Studies (SAPS) are not open to Erasmus+ students.

Language Requirements (To be proven at the time of application)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We expect students to have at least level B2 in the language of instruction / working language. • To prove that they have sufficient command in the respective language(s), students must submit a Certificate of Language Proficiency with their application. • If students wish to take classes in both English and German, both languages must be certified. • Students who have only level B1 in German at the time of application may be accepted under the condition that they participate in the Intensive German Language Course prior to the beginning of their studies (September / March) • Students wishing to do practical work in a hospital (elective/clerkship/rotation) must prove that they have min. level B2 in German at the time of application. 	
Learning Agreements	Students should not send an Erasmus+ learning agreement with their application. Instead, they should fill out our <u>Study Proposal form</u> , listing all the courses they are interested in. If they are accepted, they receive feedback on these courses, based on which they can make out a learning agreement.
