2. First important steps if you want to start studying in 2026

Submission of documents to the MSc Finance Team

Fill in, sign and return the following documents available on the MSc Finance website to mscfinance@uni-ulm.de. You should do this by **June 15, 2026**.

- Letter of Acceptance (if you like to accept your study place and start studying in 2026)
- Housing Request (if you like to reserve a room in a dormitory)

Payments due soon

- Please transfer the general student administrative fee to Ulm University (see section “Payment to Ulm University” below). If you are liable for tuition fees, you can pay the student administration fee together with the tuition fees. You can find further information in the [campus portal](#) and on your admission notification.
- If you like to reserve a room in a dormitory, please transfer the security deposit of €1,080 to the Studierendenwerk Ulm (i.e., the student services body) within two weeks after submitting the housing request in order to confirm your reservation of a dormitory room (see section “Payment to the Studierendenwerk”).

Visa

If necessary in your case, apply for a visa at a German embassy in your country as soon as possible (see Section Visa).

Enrollment process on the Campus portal

Please go through the enrollment process on the [campus portal](#). There, you will find additional information on submitting official documents — such as your official Bachelor’s Transcript or your proof of language proficiency — as well as enrollment deadlines. You should also find an overview of the payments and the intended purpose for the payments when going through the enrollment process.

3. Payment to Ulm University

By paying the general student administrative fee you validate your acceptance of a study place in the MSc Finance program. The payment will be used to cover the administrative fee that every student at Ulm University has to pay. Please pay after having accepted your admission. The payment deadline, amount and reason for bank transfer can be found in the [campus portal](#). The current administrative fee that is due for all students for the winter semester 2026/2027 amounts to €192.

Your payment must be in Euro (€). No other currency will be accepted. The university must receive the exact amount. **All fees that might occur for the transfer of the money have to be covered by you.**

You can find the purpose of use for the transfer in the [campus portal](#) and on your notification of tuition fees (only if you are liable for tuition fees). Make sure to provide your application number (which is stated on the admission letter) and both your last and first name when making the money transfer. If your money transfer form does not allow so many characters, trim the information at the end. We will be able to identify you with the application number and the rest of the information.

Please use the information from the information given on the [campus portal](#) to make your payment. It should appear like this:

Please note that the application number you should use here is the one provided in your admission notification from Ulm University, not the uni-assist application number.

4. Payment to the Studierendenwerk (if you request a room in a dorm)

The *MSc Finance team* and the *Studierendenwerk* (German name for the student services body) will arrange for a room reservation at a dormitory of the Studierendenwerk for you in advance if you

- a. fill in the "Housing Request Form" correspondingly (you do **NOT** have to additionally fill in the online application on the Studierendenwerk homepage!) and
- b. pay a security deposit of €1,080 (housing deposit, first rent, fees).

Please pay immediately after having accepted your admission and having submitted your housing request form. If you fail to pay within two weeks after sending the housing request (at the end of June latest), your application for the reservation of a dormitory room may not be affirmed.

All fees that might occur for the transfer of the money have to be covered by you. Make sure to transfer the amount of €1,080 directly to the Studierendenwerk, using the following information:

If you ask us to reserve a room but then want to cancel your reservation, please inform us as soon as possible (see the section "Withdrawal from the program"). If you do not inform us of your reservation cancellation at least ten weeks before the start of the semester, the Studierendenwerk can charge you for the lost rent.

Please address **all questions related to housing exclusively to mscfinance@uni-ulm.de**

Rooms will be distributed on a first-come first-serve basis according to your housing request and the payment.

Once you have arrived in Ulm, the Studierendenwerk will use the amount of €1,080 for the first monthly rent, the security deposit that must be provided at the start of the rental agreement, a processing fee of €20 and, if applicable, the fee of €70 for bedding.

Usually, the monthly rental payments are expected to be between €300 and €480.

5. Visa

Students from many countries need a visa for entering Germany. Here are two useful links for getting information about visa requirements and the visa process:

If you need a visa,

- please make an appointment at the German embassy or consulate to apply for a student visa. Please do this as soon as possible as it may take considerable time until you get an appointment.
- check the requirements for the visa application and start preparing this. In particular, please pay attention to the proof of financial means if this is required in your case.

Below, we provide you with some selected useful information related to visa.

To apply for a visa for study purposes you typically have to present the following documents at the embassy (please consult the information provided by your embassy for the exact visa requirements for your country):

- The admission notification, which will be provided to you via your account at Ulm University ([campus portal](#)).
- For the MSc Finance program you do not need a proof of German language skills since the program is taught in English
- Proof of (travel) [health insurance](#)
- Valid passport
- Biometric passport photos
- [Proof of financial resources](#): This is to verify that you can finance your stay in Germany for at least one year. Inquire at the German embassy in your country about how you can provide proof that you have sufficient financial resources, and which amount you need to prove. Several types of proof may be accepted
 - Security on a blocked account
 - Proof of parents' income and assets
 - Scholarship from a recognized scholarship provider
 - Bank guarantee
 - Someone, whose permanent place of residence is in Germany, agrees to bear the costs for you.

There are offers that bundle blocked account and health insurance as well as additional consulting in one package, e.g. [expatrio](#), [fintiba](#) and others.

Residence permit: A student visa is usually valid for three months. For the period thereafter, you need a residence permit (“Aufenthaltserlaubnis”) which is linked to a restricted purpose, in your case studying. The residence permit can only be obtained by applying in person at the local foreign authorities (*Ausländeramt* or *Ausländerbehörde*) within three months after arrival in Ulm. You will receive further information on the residence permit once you arrive in Ulm.

6. Information on housing and dormitories

- Rooms on the private market are usually more expensive than those let by the *Studierendenwerk*. We cannot give any assistance in finding a private room.
- The rent for a student dormitory room let by the *Studierendenwerk* varies between approx. €300 and €480 per month. In addition, a deposit of currently €600 is due. The deposit is refundable and will be paid back after you leave the residence in good conditions. On moving in, a handling fee of €20 is charged once. The total amount due by the end of June amounts to €1,080 (please see 4. Payment to the *Studierendenwerk*).
- You will be notified about a successful reservation by separate email in July or August. Please note that we will only be able to provide you with your postal address at a later date.
- The monthly rent includes fees for heating, water, electricity, and internet access. What is not included is a fee for public radio and TV, which is compulsory in Germany. It is up to €18.36 per month, and you can arrange the payment with your flatmates.
- You can move into your room no earlier than October 1, 2026; however, we recommend that you arrive in Ulm at the earliest on October 2 to ensure a smooth arrival process.
- We, the Institute of Finance, will collect the keys to your dorm rooms on October 1. You can then either get them from the designated student assigned to you (see 12. Pick up service) or pick them up directly from us.
- You cannot influence the choice of a particular dormitory or a room with a specific monthly rent.
- Most of the rooms do not have their own bathroom. Kitchen, bathroom and toilets are shared by several students.
- The dormitories are mixed-gender dormitories, however the shared flats and bathrooms normally are used by men or women separately.
- Dormitory rooms are furnished with bed, table, chair and book shelf.
- Blanket, pillow, and bed sheets can either be bought at a cost of €70 and will then be provided by the *Studierendenwerk*, or you will have to bring or buy the bedding on your own. Please tick the appropriate box in the “Housing Request Form”.
- Kitchens are equipped with an electric stove, refrigerator and sometimes pots for cooking.
- Laundry facilities are available.
- No cleaning service is provided and you will be responsible for cleaning your room yourself. In addition, you must participate in common duties such as keeping the kitchen and bathroom clean, which you share with your floor mates.

7. Tuition fees

The tuition fees for international students who are not EU nationals are €1,500 per semester, i.e., €3,000 per year.

If you are liable to pay tuition fees, you will receive a notification in addition to your letter of admission (“Gebührenbescheid” via [campus portal](#)). Please take note of this notification and pay the tuition fees within the given deadline. Otherwise you won't be permitted to enroll!

If one of the exceptions described in the tuition fee notification applies to you, promptly return the corresponding information sheet including documents of proof to the email address given in that document.

Students who have already completed a Master's degree in Germany and then pursue another Master's degree in Germany may be charged €650 per semester. If you are liable to pay this kind of tuition fee, you will receive a notification of fees in addition to your letter of admission. Please take note of this notification and promptly return the corresponding information sheet.

8. Health insurance

Health insurance is compulsory for everybody in Germany. The public health insurance covers standard medical care and preventive treatment.

Students should make sure to take care of their health insurance status before coming to Germany. Anyone who wants to enroll at a German university must have health insurance. Depending on the country you come from, your health insurance may also be valid in Germany. Please check this well before you come to Germany. You can find further information on health insurance [online](#). Health insurance providers, such as [expatrio](#) or [fintiba](#) also offer webinars.

Make sure to not buy a travel insurance for several months; instead, obtain regular insurance coverage

Conditions and charges depend on your age and are approximately €120 per month for students under thirty. You will get additional information once you are here as health insurance representatives will be present during the Welcome Week.

As soon as you have health insurance, the health insurance company will send the necessary M10 notification to the university. Please always contact your health insurance company if you have any questions about the M10 notification.

9. Withdrawal from the program

If you first accept the study place but then want to withdraw for some reason, please inform us as soon as possible and please pay attention to the following information.

Reimbursement of security deposit

If you requested a room in a dormitory but then want to cancel the room prior to the start of the contract (October 1), the Studierendenwerk tries to rent the room to another student. In case it is not possible to find a substitute person as of October 1, you will be charged up to two monthly rents plus an administrative fee of €20 if the rental contract is not cancelled *10 weeks* prior to the start of contract.

If a dormitory room is cancelled on or after October 1, your contract has started. This means that you are under § 11 of the General Rental Conditions (Allgemeine Mietbedingungen), according to which you may only cancel your contract with eight weeks notice towards the end of a month. You will then have to make additional payments on top of the €1,080 that you already transferred as a security deposit. Please bear this information in mind when, for example, encountering difficulties with your visa. **All transfer fees will be at your charge.**

Reimbursement of tuition fees

If you have already paid tuition fees but do not enroll at Ulm University, the fees will be reimbursed. **All transfer fees will be at your charge.**

10. Travel information

How to get to Ulm

The big international airports closest to Ulm are Stuttgart, Munich (München), and Frankfurt (Frankfurt am Main). The closest airport is Memmingen, which is mainly connected to destinations in Europe.

To get from one of the airports to Ulm you can take a train (<https://int.bahn.de/en>) or, possibly, a long-distance bus (<https://www.flixbus.de/>).

In Germany there are three different categories of long distance trains:

IRE, RE – usually the cheapest way to travel

EC = Eurocity or IC = Intercity: more expensive, but faster and more comfortable

ICE - Intercity Express = the fastest and often the most expensive option.

If you book a particular connection in advance, you may be able to get a ticket at a discount. However, you may then not be able to cancel or rebook it, or you may have to pay a cancellation fee. This depends on the type of ticket you bought.

11. Weather

Most students find the climate generally pleasant. However, it varies considerably through the year. During the winter season, temperatures vary from +10 to -15 °C. The average temperature in January is 1,5°C. There is usually a mix of cold dry weather, snow, and rain.

March to April and October to November are characterized by cloudy or rainy periods that alternate with sunny days. Temperatures are between 0° and 20°C.

In summer (July-August) daytime temperatures are normally around 25 °C, and may reach 35°C. The average temperature in July is about 18°C. Sunny and dry periods alternate with rainy periods.

Night-time temperatures are often 10 °C lower than daytime temperatures.

You see, you will need all types of clothes, from warm to very cold. Sweaters and a warm coat are necessary, but of course you don't need to bring everything with you. Ulm is a good place to shop for clothes.

12. Financing possibilities and expenses

In this document, we already provided information related to important expenses (administrative fee, tuition fees if applicable, rents, health insurance). Here, we only mention important expenses other than expenses for food, clothing etc.:

- Ticket for public transport (including regional trains in Germany): €540 per year ([D-Ticket JugendBW](#) for students under 27 years of age)
- Fee for the electronic residence permit: approx. €100.

13. Arrival in Ulm, orientation program and pickup service

Classes start on October 12. Before that date, there will be some organizational and welcome events, so it is recommended that you arrive in Ulm in the beginning of October.

Before classes start, we organize meetings to help you deal with important bureaucratic matters (residence permit, enrolment, health insurance, etc.) and to help you find your way around the campus and Ulm. You will also meet fellow students and instructors from the program. Detailed information will be sent out in September.

If you have reserved a room in a student dorm (Housing request form) and arrive in early October, we gladly organize a pickup service for all students who have a room in one of our dormitories. A current student of the university will pick you up at your arrival location in Ulm, take you to your dormitory and will accompany you to the first welcome event. To arrange the pickup service, we need to know the exact date and time of your arrival. Pickup on weekends and after 8 pm is NOT possible. Please arrange your travel plans accordingly.

You will receive information on how to apply for the pickup service in September.

A word at the end: We know that there are a lot of things you have to consider when you start studying. But we're not just trying to help you as much as possible. It is also worth it. So many students have made it before you, and we are confident that you will be able to look back on all these efforts with a smile once you are in Ulm. 😊
