## Succesfull exposure workshop in Utrecht

On September 17-18 an exposure workshop was organized at IRAS in the Netherlands. There were in total 25 participants from all the groups that will start their measurements in the first year. During these two days there were explanations and discussions about site selection, how to conduct PM and NOx measurements, and about everything else related to field work and the measurement campaign. Participants could practice the use of sampling equipment.

### **ESCAPE** contract finally signed

After a long period of negotiations and continued refinement of the Description of Work and the Consortium Agreement, the ESCAPE contract has finally been signed by the EU and by all involved parties. We anticipate the first payment from the EU anytime, and we will distribute the first term right away to all participating centers.


