

## SHORT BIOGRAPHY

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Dr. Laurence de Leval is Professor of Pathology and Director of the Institute of Pathology at the University Hospital of Lausanne, Switzerland. She received her medical degree from the University of Liège (Belgium) and completed a two-year postdoctoral fellowship in hematopathology at Harvard Medical School. Her research on non-Hodgkin's lymphoma was awarded the InBev-Baillet Latour Prize for Clinical Research in 2009 and she received the Benjamin Castleman Award from the United States and Canadian Academy of Pathology in 2008 for her discovery of the follicular helper T-cell derivation of angioimmunoblastic T-cell lymphoma. Her current research is focused on exploring the genetic bases and molecular pathogenesis of NK/T-cell malignancies. Other interests include implementing and optimizing tools for the molecular diagnosis of hematological malignancies and other cancers. Dr. de Leval is an internationally recognized hematopathology expert and the author of more than 300 scientific publications and several chapters in reference textbooks. Dr de Leval is the pathology chair of the T-cell lymphoma working group of the LYSA (LYmphoma Study Association) and reference pathologist for clinical trials. She is a member of several national and international scientific societies, elected member of the International Lymphoma Study Group and a corresponding member of the Belgian Royal Academy of Medicine.
